



Comic Book Grammar

Why is grammar necessary and relevant? We speak and write every single day! Your task is to create a comic book that uses punctuation and grammar correctly. You and a partner (or alone) will write and illustrate a story of your choice that includes the grammar rules below.

The best projects are ones that are creative and authentic, neat and organized, and include the following criteria:

1. simple sentence
2. compound sentence
3. complex sentence
4. compound-complex sentence
5. interjection
6. capitalization – proper nouns
7. avoiding run-on sentences; correctly using semi-colons
8. definite and indefinite pronouns
9. gerund (a verb functioning as a noun which always end in *-ing*)
10. past and present tense verbs
11. a variety of adjectives
12. adverbs
13. prepositions/prepositional phrase

Please note that you must be aware of spelling, correct capitalization and punctuation, and coherence in the story.

Requirements:

1. Your comic book must contain at least 20 sentences that meet the above criteria.
2. When you submit your comic book you must submit a “key” that identifies the grammar rule and the sentences from your book.
3. You may create your comic book using online or digital media (websites, PowerPoint, PhotoStory, etc.) or by hand.
4. The comic book must have color.
5. The comic book and story line must be appropriate for school (keep it PG-13 people).
6. It must be creative and coherent; don’t write a story that is inappropriate, incoherent and/or nonsensical.
7. If you are working with a partner, you must work together and equally participate in the project.



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
