- 2. In Hopkin's "Spring and Fall," what is Margaret ostensibly grieving over and what is she really grieving for?
- 3. Based on Housman's poem what "lesson" has the speaker in "When I was One-and Twenty" learned?
- 4. What do the "roads" represent in Frost's "The Road Not Taken"?
- 5. Explain the difference in the advice the father in Meinke's "Advice to My Son" and the mother in Mezey's "My Mother" give to their sons?
- 6. What does the fifth-grade girl in Peacock's "Our Room" disclose to her classmates? What is the significance of the change in the final line as "I" gives way to "we"?
- 7. In Dylan's "Do Not Go Gentle into That Good Night" what does the night symbolize? Why don't wise men go gentle into the good night?
- 8. Why does the speaker's mother in Cisneros's "My Wicked Wicked Ways" "get very mad" about? What do the last few lines mean?
